A low-carbon economy (LCE), low-fossil-fuel economy (LFFE), or decarbonised economy is an economy based on low carbon power sources that therefore has a minimal output of greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions into the biosphere, but specifically refers to the greenhouse gas carbon dioxide. The metropolitan areas of Ciudad Juárez, Monterrey, León, and Puebla now have better instruments for integrating environmental and climate-change components into their urban transport and land-use plans. The international community has recognized the need to reduce greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions by 50% until 2050 in order to keep the change in global mean temperature within two degrees centigrade compared to preindustrial times.
